WHEREAS, nearly 8,000 community leaders and business professionals who make up Florida's 259 Kiwanis Clubs and the more than 20,000 members of school-based Service Leadership Programs are committed to providing a variety of opportunities for every member of the community to become competent, capable and compassionate leaders through service and advocacy efforts that make our communities better places for people to live and work; and
